Dr. Chic Wilson is a Seattle native and graduate of the UW School of Medicine. For over 30 years he has collaborated with other interested vasectomy doctors to advance modern vasectomy technique. His contributions include the Wilson vasectomy forceps, the no-scalpel vasectomy training model and training videos procedure workshops on No-Scalpel

Vasectomy, Advanced Vasectomy Techniques, and No-Needle Anesthesia. He created the peer-reviewed AAFP monograph and video guide No-Scalpel Vasectomy for the Family Physician.

In addition to private practice, Dr. Wilson is a Clinical Associate Professor in the University of Washington School of Medicine, where he teaches medicine and surgery to physicians and medical students. He is a Fellow of the American Academy of Family Physicians.

<u>Medical Ethicist</u> Gwendolyn P. Quinn, Ph.D., M.Ed, MPH



Dr. Quinn is the Livia Wan Endowed Chair and Vice Chair of Research in the Department of OB-GYN and Professor in Population Health and the Division of Medical Ethics in the New York University Grossman School of Medicine. She is a member of the NYU faculty senate and chair of the department's appointment, promotion, and tenure

committee. Her research focuses on patient-provider communication across a variety of topics but primarily in reproductive health and cancer in adolescent and young adults, LGBTQ health issues, uptake of genetic counseling, clinical trials and access to care for minority and underserved populations. Prior to joining NYU in 2017, she was at Moffitt Cancer Center and the University of South Florida for 17 years. She is the author of over 300 peer reviewed papers and books chapters and has received more than 3 million dollars in federal and foundation grant funding.
